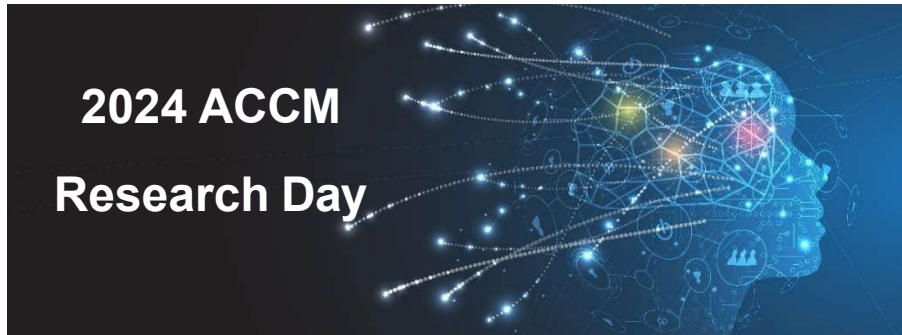


Instructions for Abstract Preparation



Participants must submit both a full abstract and an ultra-mini abstract.

Instructions for Full Abstracts

How to name the file

AuthorLastName_[at least 1-2 unique words from title, especially if submitting multiple abstracts]_datesubmitted

Example: Gomez_Microbiome_2024.10.12

Formatting requirements

- 1 page maximum (8.5"x11" letter size)
- 1-inch margins on all sides
- 11-point Arial font only
- Word document (.doc or .docx)

Abstract requirements

- Include the title of the abstract at the top of the document
- Include all author names (First Name + Middle Initial (if applicable) + Last Name) and author degrees directly under the title
- Include affiliations for all authors. Use superscript numbers.
- Abstracts may be structured (with subheadings) or unstructured (no subheadings)
- Do not include references
- Figures or tables are allowable as long as the abstract does not exceed 1 page

Instructions for Ultra-Mini Abstracts

- Ultra-mini abstracts must be 50 words or fewer.
- They should consist of 2 to 3 sentences that provide the main result and the clinical, translational, or educational implications.
- Ultra-mini abstracts should be submitted by copying into the abstract submission form.
- Example:

In patients undergoing descending and thoracoabdominal aortic aneurysm repair, intrathecal papaverine included among the adjuncts for spinal cord protection was associated with reduced permanent paraplegia and paraparesis. Adding intrathecal papaverine to the neuroprotective protocol may enhance spinal cord perfusion and provide additional spinal cord protection.

Abstracts that do not adhere to these requirements will need to be resubmitted.
